#### **ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:**

The Government may introduce changes to access and use of outdoor play areas depending on the severity of public restrictions. The Risk assessment and safe systems of working will need to be adjusted in response to those. In principle, if general care is taken to observe *hands* (regular sanitising, washing), *face* – adults and older young people wear a face covering, *space* – avoiding close contact and queuing, risks to the public will be reduced.

The Parish Council will promote these behaviours on social media and in play area signage.

Staff are instructed to monitor condition and use of play areas and to take steps to observe their own Covid working practices.

Generally there is limited seating available in our play areas sites so this should reduce length of stay and other routes for transmission. All equipment is outdoors and uncovered so will be subject to the natural elements e.g. rain, snow. Access is unrestricted so it is not practical to introduce staff supervised play. Users will be notified that the equipment is not sanitised.

All spaces will be monitored however it will be expected that those using the sites take care to observe the signs and follow the advice and guidance.

The Parish Council could consider provision of hand sanitiser units however it is extremely likely that these would be vandalised or stolen.
