Updates Report

1. Overview

1.1 Murals project

To support the Parish Council's commitment to reduce graffiti tags and add to our public art works, the murals project is progressing:

- The mural at Sparcells to Peatmoor lake is nearing completion with the addition of wingwall artwork
- The mural sponsored by GLL at the West Swindon District Centre to Shaw Ridge subway is getting underway and should be completed in the next two weeks.

1.2 Community Pantry

 The Community Pantry at West Swindon library is open and is being used for collection and donation (not always with useful items). It is accessible only during library opening times. A new mini pantry has been installed in the foyer of Freshbrook Community Centre and has been working well. The pantry cart is used outside of the Parish depot and is working well with a weekly drop off to Wilkes Academy.

1.3 Love where you learn Litter Boards

 The Engagement Officer and Cllr G Philpot have participated in a school council conversation at Hazelwood Academy and assembly at Oliver Tomkins to promote dialogue on litter and environmental issues. We anticipate additional schools to receive boards shortly.

1.4 Rivermead Bike Station

 The freestanding bike tool station has been installed at Rivermead near the pump track and skate park. The team has also suggested that a noticeboard be installed in this location to improve and promote communication about youth activities. This could potentially be attached to the existing sign.

1.5 Rivermead Half Term Event

 Swindon ATB and Ed Poster hosted a joint event at Rivermead offering an additional skate session alongside the opportunity



to learn a bit more about street art utilising the addition of a third street art board. Both sessions were well attended and feedback from young people and parents was positive.

1.6 Little Libraries

The team is excited to report that it has built a set of new little libraries which are planned to be added in Freshbrook, Grange Park, Middleleaze, Shaw, Sparcells and Swinley Drive. The individual libraries have been hand-decorated in the same colours so that they are visible and identifiable. Local residents have come forward to be the custodians, keeping a check on stock levels and any damage or misuse. The existing library at Peatmoor lake will be replaced with the new version which will be better able to hold an array of books.

1.7 Movember

Promoting positive health awareness across our population with the Movember theme has been underway through November. Activities have included

- Ramblers walk to Lower Shaw Farm
- Nxxt Step Fitness introductory session
- Swindon Striders run
- Cycle ride from Lydiard Park
- · Chess and games session

Councillors feedback on continued interest in linking the Parish Council to health awareness raising promotions would be welcome.

1.8 Youth Events

- **Swindon Youth For Christ** are proposing to hold a one off event in December at the Link Centre as a trial for future sessions (to be funded by West Swindon Parish Council)
- Swindon ATB Indoor Session details to be finalised which focus on a short session from an indoor location, likely to be 21st December and from Freshbrook Community Centre or the Link Centre
