## 1. Swindon Borough Council Consultations

1.1 Swindon Borough Council has the following consultations currently open in the event that West Swindon Parish Council may wish to make an official comment:

## Anti Social Behaviour Survey.

Swindon Community Safety team complete a yearly Anti-social behaviour Survey with residents of Swindon. The results of the survey map the persistent issues that residents are experiencing, and helps target funding and resources.

Borough Wide - Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) renewal consultation 2025 This consultation is to seek views on the potential renewal of the Borough Wide Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO). PSPOs were introduced as part of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 and are designed to ensure that people can enjoy public spaces without the threat of anti-social behaviour. Under this order, people would be given a chance to pick up after their dogs before a fine is actioned. People who refuse to pick up after their dog would be served a Fixed Penalty Notice and their details noted. Repeat offenders could face prosecution.
